# From the Rabbi's Study...



Every so often I am approached by a congregant who tells me that he cannot read the Hebrew prayers, and therefore, doesn't get the spiritual feeling of prayer. With the approaching of *the Yamim Noraim* - Days of Awe – I thought it appropriate to relay a story that I heard many years ago.

It seems there was a young boy in the city of Vilna whose parents did not have the means to send him to cheder for his Jewish education. As a result, he never learned Hebrew and was unable to pray. However, his father did make a recorder for him out of a reed, and the boy taught himself to play. Each Shabbat he would accompany his father to shul, but since musical instruments are forbidden on Shabbat, his father wouldn't let his son take his recorder to services. On Yom Kippur following the boy's thirteenth birthday, the boy became very distraught because he was unable to pray like the rest of the congregation. During the final N'eila service, the boy couldn't contain himself any longer. He took out his recorder and played it as beautifully as he could. Of course his father and the entire congregation became very angry with him, and the boy ran out of the shul and went home. After Yom Kippur was over the rebbe of the shul went over to the father. The father began to apologize for his son's behavior when the rebbe stopped him and said, "Tonight, just as the gates of heaven were about to close, the fate of our entire congregation was hanging in the balance. However, when your son played his recorder with such feeling and devotion, it swayed G-d's judgment favorably for us. We all have your son to thank for a good upcoming year."

The point of the story is to teach us that when we all get together on the High Holy Days or at any occasion, to *daven* as a congregation, we should pray using whatever means we have. If we are unable to *daven* in Hebrew, then we should use the English. If the English doesn't give us what we are looking for, then we should close our eyes and let the spiritual melodies move us. If we are able to sing along, sing; if not, hum.

That being said, there is another ingredient for a meaningful prayer experience, and that is preparation. Just attending *shul* year after year without making an attempt to understand what the prayers are trying to convey, why we recite them on the High Holy Days and how they influence our thoughts, emotions and actions, will not give us the knowledge that is necessary to make the prayer service meaningful. I urge all of you to take the time and learn about our rich liturgy. You

#### KIDDUSH ON ROSH HASHANAH

Inasmuch as most prayerbooks do not contain the daytime *Rosh Hashanah Kiddush* recited before luncheon upon returning home from the synagogue, we are furnishing the text for your information:

תִּקְעוּ בַּתְּׂלֶשׁ שׁוֹפָּר, בַּכֶּסֶה לְיוֹם חַגֵּנוּ. בִּי חֹק לִיִשִּׂרָאֵל הוּא, מִשְׁפָּט לֵאלֹהֵי יַעְקֹב.

Tik-u bachodesh shofar, bakeseh l'yom chagaynu. ki chok l'yisrael hu, mishpat lay-lohay Yaakov.

(סַבְּרִי מָרָנָן וְרַבּּנָן וְרַבּוֹתֵי) בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה ה' אֱלֹקֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלְם, בּוֹרֵא פְּרִי הַגְּפֶּן.

#### **ERUV TAVSHILIN**

This year, with *Rosh Hashanah*, September 25 and 26, falling on a Thursday and Friday, the ritual of *Eruv Tavshilin* is to be recited on Wednesday before candlelighting.

When any major festival falls on a Friday, in order that it may be permissible to cook on that day for Saturday (one is permitted to cook on a holiday for that day alone), the head of the household must perform the ritual of "*Eruv Tavshilin*" before the festival. This ceremony should be performed late afternoon on Wednesday, September 24 before *Rosh Hashanah*. This consists of taking some bread and some other food, such as fish or meat, putting them on a plate, raising it and then reciting the following prayers:

בַּהְדִין עֵרוּבָא יְהֵא שָרֵא לָנֶא לְאַפּוּקֵי וּלְבַשוּלֵי וּלְאַטְמוּנֵי וּלְאַדְלוּקֵי שְרָגָא וּלְתַקָּנָא וּלְמֶעְבַּד כָּל צְרְכָּנָא, מִיּוֹמָא טָבָא לְשַבְּתָא. לְנוּ, וּלְכָל יִשָּרָאֵל הַדָּרִים בָּעִיר הַזּאת.

Blessed art Thou, Eternal our G-d, Ruler of the Universe. Who made us holy with His commandments, and commanded us concerning the *Eruv*. With this *Eruv* it shall be permissible for us to bake, cook and to keep the food warm; to light the candles, and to prepare all necessary things on the festival for the *Sabbath*. This shall be permitted to us and to all Jews who live in this city.

#### **TASHLICH**

*Tashlich* comes from the Hebrew word meaning "to cast," referring to the intent to cast away our sins via this meaningful and ancient Jewish custom common to both Ashkenazi and Sephardic communities, and is performed on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah* (Second day if first day is *Shabbat*).

*Tashlich* is preferably recited alongside a body of water containing fish, to remind us that just as fish are protected by the water in which they live, we pray to be protected by G-d. Also, just as fish swim freely and can suddenly be caught in a net, so too we can just as helplessly fall into the net of sin. And even as the eyes of fish are always open, so do we pray that G-d too will keep vigilant watch over his people.

Needless to say, the physical motions near the water and fish of *Tashlich* are not what grant us atonement. But if we pay attention to the symbolism and apply the sincere desire to heal our relationship with G-d as portrayed in the physical demonstrations of *Tashlich*, then it serves as a crucial part in the process of repenting and returning to G-d in purity.

Please join in and participate in the *Tashlich* service by meeting on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*, Thursday, September 25 at 105th and Conser over Indian Creek at approximately 6:00 p.m. *Tashlich* will conclude in time to return to the synagogue for the 6:30 p.m. *Mincha* and *Yom Tov Maariv*.

# FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Those driving to the synagogue for the High Holy Days are reminded that the Overland Park Police Department will be ticketing any vehicles parked in fire lanes (located on the south and east sides of the synagogue building). Also, designated handicapped parking is reserved for only those persons prominently displaying the handicapped sign. We ask that you cooperate fully. There is a fine for those not in compliance with the disabled parking ordinance. Thank you.

#### YOM KIPPUR REMINDER

Just a reminder that on *Yom Kippur* night and all day, all laws of *Shabbat* apply. Also, it is very important for those of you affected by the Overland Park *Eruv* to call the *Eruv* Hotline at 791.8080 late in the afternoon of the eve of *Yom Kippur* to verify the *Eruv* is "up" and functioning as we do on the eve of every *Shabbat*.
