"As we accept charitable donations, please have your credit and debit cards ready." "You can log on to the shul Wi-Fi using the password 'Hashem18.' The ushers will circulate mobile card swipe machines among the congregants: Those who prefer to make electronic fund transfers are directed to computers and laptops at the rear of the shul. Those who prefer to use iPads can open them. Those who prefer telephone banking, take out your cell phones to transfer your contributions to the shul account.

This week's class will be held on the various Facebook group pages where the usual group chatting takes place. Please log in and don't miss out. Thursday's Talmud Torah study will be held live on Skype at 1900hrs GMT. You can follow the rabbi on Twitter this weekend for counselling and prayers.

There is such a vast amount of knowledge on the internet, and our computers, iPads, smart phones etc. have become an integral part of our lives. However, the electronic age is, at the same time, depriving us of something special: personal relationships. [One might keep up with what's going on in other people's lives, but in my humble opinion, a genuine relationship can only be real when people interact face-to-face.] This phenomenon is not new. Before the electronic age, one created a similar connection with another person by mail. This connection was called pen pals. And although one could get to know another person and even develop a friendship through mail correspondence, unless people spend time together, there will always be something lacking in this type of relationship.

A perfect example is online dating services that match you up with another person. On paper you may seem perfect for each other, and the online correspondence can go very well, but only after you meet and interact in person, look into each other's eyes, see the person smile and walk together hand-in-hand, can you truly know if that other person is right for you.

As usual, Judaism was way ahead of the times when it developed the concept of a synagogue, and until recently, Jewish life revolved around the synagogue. Families came together, young and old, to pray and learn, to socialize and form friendships, to celebrate and even mourn together. And, if you were fortunate, it was the place to find your soul mate.

The synagogue model is perfect. However, many Jewish people communicate in chat rooms, on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, and tragically do not feel the need to strengthen their Jewish

The historical mourning period for the destruction of the Temple begins with the 17th of *Tammuz*, when the wall to Jerusalem was broken through, and ends with the capture of the city and the razing of the Temple on *Tisha B'Av*, the 9th of *Av*, three weeks later which is July 25 this year.

SUNDAY, JULY 26

Tisha B'Av (the ninth day of the Jewish month of Av) is a day of mourning during which Jews fast and bewail the destruction of the Temple and Jerusalem. Along with Yom Kippur, it is the only full day fast on our calendar. This fact alone should impress upon us the importance that is placed on the observance of this day for all Jews. The preceding period, known as the "three weeks" that began with the Fast of Tammuz on Sunday, July 5, is considered to be the saddest time in the Jewish calendar when all evidence of joy disappears until the conclusion of Tisha B'Av.

Since World War II, many Jews have chosen Tisha B'Av as the day to commemorate the (yahrzeit) loss of those family members who were killed by the Nazis and their associates on dates that are unknown. The Talmud states that G-d decreed this particular day as a day of woe and misfortune in the very beginning of Jewish history. According to this interpretation, the ninth of Av was the day when the Jews in the desert of Sinai bewailed their lot when the spies brought back bad tidings from Canaan (Parshat Shelach). So G-d declared: "You cried without cause; I will, therefore, make this an eternal day of mourning for you." And it was then that the decree was ordered for the destruction of the Temple, and the scattering of the Jews amongst the peoples of the earth.
