From the Rabbi's Study...



Pesach is the holiday that commemorates our exodus from Egypt. We are commanded in the *Torah* to tell our children the story of the miraculous way in which God delivered us from slavery to freedom. Our houses are turned inside out every year so each family can conduct a *seder* and retell the story. One might ask if there ever would come a time when we can say that we already know the story well, and therefore, there is no need to conduct a *seder*. The answer to this question is, no.

First, if one conducts a *seder* properly, there is always something new and relevant that can be derived from retelling and reviewing the story annually, as well as interjecting contemporary readings, poems and innovative ideas. After all, our goal is not only to retell the miraculous incidents that lead to the creation of the Israelite nation, but to also relate the *seder* to today's living. One might even correlate the *Pesach* story with the creation of the State of Israel.

Second, each year our children reach a new level of understanding, and our history can be discussed with them on this new level, giving the *seder* a deeper and greater meaning, and third, each year, a new generation comes to the table who needs to be taught about our beginnings. In other words, the *seder* is the original "never ending story."

The importance of the exodus from Egypt is demonstrated by the fact that the *kiddush* and liturgy of every one of our festivals, including *Shabbat*, makes reference to the exodus. The term used in our liturgy is *zaycher l'tziat mitzrayim* – in remembrance to the exodus from Egypt. The question today is, why is the exodus so important for us to remember? There are several possible answers. First, in order to know who we are and what our mission in life is, we must know from whence we came. If G-d did not redeem us from slavery, we would not be here today celebrating our heritage. If you remember the mini-series "Roots," you will recall that throughout the series, the story of the origin of the family was passed down from generation to generation. We as Jews must remember the roads we have traveled that brought us to where we are today. Otherwise, we are a people without a past and without any direction towards the future.

Second, we must teach our children about the dangers of all the different forms of slavery. In Egypt, our time was not our own. We were at the mercy of our taskmasters' will. Fathers were not able to spend any quality time with their families. Mothers had the sole burden of raising the children. These dysfunctional families resulted in a people full of despair, without hope and purpose. We often see this kind of slavery in today's society where people become slaves to their jobs and to the almighty dollar, and lose sight of the precious gifts that G-d has given us, our children. Families are so over programmed that children hardly ever experience family togetherness. Therefore we are commanded every year to gather together as a family and explore, through the story of the exodus, the real meaning of life, which is, to be a close-knit family imbued with Jewish values and not to be enslaved to our environment.

Therefore, Judaism teaches us that we must remember the exodus throughout the year, on every Jewish festival as well as on *Shabbat*. By observing *Shabbat* and holidays, we are forced to leave our weekly taskmasters and spend real quality time with our families. Our emancipation from Egypt is to be a constant reminder to us that we should never allow ourselves to become so physically or emotionally enslaved that we neglect our children. Without our children, there is no future.

PESACH SCHEDULE

Mechirat Chametz - Ritual disposal of *chametz* by the traditional form of "sale" can be arranged **until Friday morning**, April 22, 9:00 am, by contacting Rabbi Shron at the synagogue office. **No arrangements can be made after 9:00 am.**

Bedikat Chametz - The searching of the house for leaven should take place Thursday evening, April 21, after dark, with the recitation of the appropriate benedictions, to be found on the opening page of the *Pesach Haggadah*.

Siyum Bechorim - A special service for the firstborn sons will be held in the Rose Morgan Chapel, Friday morning, April 22, following the *Shacharit* Service at 7:00 am. The brief ritual will include a *Siyum* (the conclusion of a Talmudic Tractate to be conducted by Rabbi Shron.) The Dr. Sigmund Mandl Memorial breakfast will be served as a *Seudat Mitzvah* in order to exempt the firstborn sons in attendance from the duty of fasting.

Z'man Issur Achilat Chametz - The eating of *chametz* is prohibited on Friday, April 22, after 11:02 am.

Biur Chametz - The burning and the removal of the *chametz* is to take place on Friday, April 22, no later than 12:02 pm. The declaration of the *Bitul Chametz* - the abandonment of *chametz* - is to be recited at this time. The text can be found in the *Pesach Haggadah* or a *Siddur*.

End of *Pesach* - *Chametz* sold before *Pesach* is permitted for use on Saturday night, April 30 after 9:00 pm.

JUST A REMINDER

Just a reminder that the words "Kosher for Pesach" must appear on boxes of matzah and matzah products, and usually the year 2016, since matzot are also made for use year-round that are not kosher for Pesach.

Please remember that to fulfill the *mitzvah* of performing your *seder* should not commence on the first night prior to **8:37 pm** and on the second night **8:39 pm**.

ERUV TAVSHILIN

This year, with the closing days of Passover taking place on Friday, April 29 and Saturday, April 30, the ritual of *Eruv Tavshilin* is to be recited on the eve of the seventh day, Thursday, April 28 before candlelighting.

When *Yom Tov* falls on a Friday, in order that it may be permissible to cook on that day for Saturday (one is permitted to cook on a holiday for that day alone), the head of the household must perform the ritual of "*Eruv Tavshilin*" before the festival. This consists of taking some *matzah* and some other food, such as fish or meat, putting them on a plate, raising it and then reciting the following prayers:

Blessed art Thou, Eternal our G-d, Ruler of the Universe, Who made us holy with His commandments, and commanded us concerning the *Eruv*. With this *Eruv* it shall be permissible for us to bake, cook and to keep the food warm; to light the candles, and to prepare all necessary things on the festival for the *Sabbath*. This shall be permitted to us and to all Jews who live in this city.

The food for this ceremony is to be eaten on *Shabbat*, April 30, the eight day of Passover, during the daytime hours.



Memorial Day services will be held in the chapel at Blue Ridge Cemetery, 1901 Blue Ridge Boulevard, on **Sunday, May 29 at 11:00 a.m.**

All orders must be paid in advance and received at the synagogue office no later than April 30. This gives us the time needed so that the plants will be in full bloom by Memorial Day this year.

Give your loved ones who are interred in our cemetery the *kovod* of remembering them, whether it's with flowers or a visit to their graves. The cemetery committee is making every effort to maintain the grounds to be clean and beautiful, and extra care is being given to keep the plants watered, trimmed and green during the summer months.

Cemetery lots are available for sale to any Jewish person. Anyone interested in reserving individual lots or family sections should call the synagogue office at 913.642.1880 ext 202 for assistance.

K.I. Blue Ridge Cemetery is open every day, with the exception of *Shabbat* and Jewish holidays. The supervisor, Rod Sipe, can assist you in finding the location of a grave site.
