From the Rabbi's Study ...



Rabbi Morris had just resigned, and Issy, the *shul* president, goes to visit him. "Rabbi," Issy says, "I've just heard the news. I'm really sorry that you've decided to leave us." "Don't worry," says Rabbi Morris. "You'll have nothing to worry about. I'm going to recommend a successor whom I believe will be better than me." "But that's exactly what's worrying me," says Issy. "Your predecessor told me exactly the same thing." Let us consider this scenario. A man and woman fall in love and get married. Soon after the honeymoon, the husband tells his new wife that his job now requires that he travel extensively, and he will be away for long periods of time. In the beginning of his travels, he calls his wife every day to see how she is doing and to

tell her that he loves her. These calls soon become weekly, then monthly, and eventually the only time that he calls is when he needs her to pay the bills, keep up the maintenance of the house and send him the various supplies that he will need for his travels. WHY IS IT CUSTOMARY TO EAT DAIRY ON *SHAVUOT*?

It has become customary on *Shavuot* to eat at least one dairy meal during the holiday. Why do we do this? The real answer is, we don't know. However, there are several explanations, and these are two possible reasons:

Reason #1 Torah is likened to milk, as the verse in *Song of Songs* says, "Like honey and milk [the *Torah*] lies under your tongue." Just as milk has the ability to fully sustain the body of a human being (i.e., a nursing baby) so, too, the *Torah* provides all the "spiritual nourishment necessary for the human soul."

Reason #2 The *gematria* (numerical value) of the Hebrew word for milk, *chalav*, is 40. We eat dairy foods on *Shavuot* to commemorate the 40 days that Moses spent on Mount Sinai receiving instructions in the entire *Torah*.






