### TASHLICH

*Tashlich* comes from the Hebrew word meaning "to cast," referring to the intent to cast away our sins on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*. (Second day if first day is *Shabbat.*) *Tashlich* is preferably recited alongside a body of water containing fish, to remind us that just as fish are protected by the water in which they live, we pray to be protected by G-d.

Please join in the *Tashlich* service on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*, **Monday**, **September 10 at 105th and Conser over Indian Creek at 5:30 pm.** *Tashlich* will conclude in time to return to the synagogue for the 6 pm *Mincha* and *Yom Tov Maariv*.

### KIDDUSH ON ROSH HASHANAH DAY

Many prayerbooks do not contain the daytime *Rosh Hashanah Kiddush* recited before lunch upon returning home from the synagogue, so we are furnishing the text for your convenience:








### CALLING ALL BOYS & GIRLS in the 1st through 5th Grades!





There is a selection of prayers in the booklet, found on pages 65 through 74, in both Hebrew and English. Please return the booklets to the chapel before leaving the cemetery.

Although the cemetery is maintained by *Kehilath Israel Synagogue*, the major building improvements, new walkways, monuments and other beautification is done primarily by private contributions. 


