From Your Rabbi...



Each year on *Rosh Hashanah* we pray for the incoming year to be better than the last. Will 5782 be better than 5781? Since I'm an optimist, I predict yes! But this is a strange time that we are living through. We appear to be in a state of "*Nisht a hin, nisht a herr,*" to use a Yiddish expression, "Neither here nor there."

We experienced what seemed like a few weeks of reprieve before the current Delta wave hit us. We are continuously monitoring medical news so please watch emails and listen to our phone tree messages for updates on the COVID protocol we are following at K.I.

Becca and I are grateful that we got to travel a bit this summer with our boys. First we went east to New York to visit my sisters and their families, and then west to Denver to see my father-in-law and my mother-in-law.

It occurred to me when reflecting on the Greek letters assigned to the various Covid variants, that the first four letters of the Greek alphabet are basically the same as those of the Hebrew *Alef Bet*: instead of Alpha, Beta, Gamma, and Delta, we have *Alef, Bet, Gimmel* and *Dalet*. And so, if we were to assign a Hebrew name to the current widespread Covid strain, we might call it the *Dalet* variant! Perhaps that's what it should, in fact, be called in Israel, although I'm pretty sure they just transliterate the word "Delta" into Hebrew letters instead.

In any case, it got me thinking about the significance of the letter *Dalet*. The *Talmud* teaches that this letter represents *Dalut*, meaning poverty and humility. That seems like a sadly apt metaphor for the Delta variant which is currently wreaking havoc amongst us. We were on a bit of a high before it hit us, and now it's humbled us back downward somewhat. Perhaps we can take comfort in the *Talmud*'s lesson that the letter *Dalet* looks forward to the letter which follows it: the letter *Heh*. This letter represents the name of G-d. And this shows that if the poor and humble person looks forward with confidence and puts his faith in G-d, he might be able to reach Him, and to overcome his challenges.

My prayer for us as *Rosh Hashanah* approaches is that this year we might all overcome our challenges and hardships, as represented by the letter *Dalet*/Delta, and to feel a sense of success and oneness with G-d, as represented by the letter *Heh*.

The prayer goes on to say that through Prayer, Repentance and Charity we can avert the severe decree.

I've noticed that during the 10 days, *Rosh Hashanah* to *Yom Kippur*, people are kinder, listen more, argue less, have a more giving attitude. We should strive to do that year round.

Many prayerbooks do not contain the daytime Rosh Hashanah Kiddush recited before lunch upon returning home from the synagogue, so we are furnishing the text for your convenience:

Dear K.I. Family,

The High Holidays are right around the corner! Meanwhile, due to the Delta variant of Covid-19, we are making some changes to services and events in our building. We have a committee which includes four prominent member physicians looking at what is going on in our community and guiding us to make decisions to help keep everyone safe.

As we have continued to express, please consult your personal physician to see if it is advisable for you to come to *shul*. Those who are erring on the side of caution due to age or immune issues should not feel guilty about not attending! Although of course we miss your presence, Jewish Law places safety and preservation of life above all other concerns. For those who will not be able to come in person for the High Holidays, we will offer some Zoom opportunities to connect.

We are blessed at K.I. with a very large space in which to *daven*. As such, we are confident that we will be able to accommodate all who want to attend, with social distancing between individuals/households. The wearing of face masks—whether vaccinated or not—is required at all times while in the building. On July 27, the CDC updated its recommendations for mask-wearing, stating that everyone should wear masks indoors, regardless of vaccine status, to help maximize protection from the Delta variant. Of course, in accordance with Jewish Law, we strongly urge you to get vaccinated if you have not done so already.

Children are welcome to attend services with their parents as long as they wear a mask at all times. We will continue to offer childcare on *Shabbat* with our highly qualified childcare worker, Amanda Greenwood. We will not be offering childcare for the High Holidays, though, due to logistics. Your children and grandchildren are welcome to attend services with you as long as they can wear a mask.

At this time, we will continue with light *kiddushim* and *seudot* outside on the back patio. The committee will meet again prior to the High Holidays to adjust our policies as needed due to the current environment. You will be kept informed of changes.

Cantor Shalowitz will join us for the High Holidays with his two sons accompanying him some on the bimah. If you were here last year, you know that they are a real treat and we hope you can come enjoy them!

We pray that the incoming year of 5782 will be a year in which we can put this pandemic behind us and return to normal shul life with renewed enthusiasm and joy. May it be, in turn, a year of renewed health and good fortune for our shul community and for the entire world!

TASHLICH

Tashlich comes from the Hebrew word meaning "to cast," referring to the intent to cast away our sins via this meaningful and ancient Jewish custom common to both Ashkenazi and Sephardic communities, and is performed on the first day of Rosh Hashanah. (Second day if first day is Shabbat)

Tashlich is preferably recited alongside a body of water containing fish, to remind us that just as fish are protected by the water in which they live, we pray to be protected by G-d. Also, just as fish swim freely and can suddenly be caught in a net, so too we can just as helplessly fall into the net of sin. And even as the eyes of fish are always open, so do we pray that G-d too will keep vigilant watch over his people.

Needless to say, the physical motions near the water and fish of *Tashlich* are not what grant us atonement. But if we pay attention to the symbolism and apply the sincere desire to heal our relationship with G-d as portrayed in the physical demonstrations of *Tashlich*, then it serves as a crucial part in the process of repenting and returning to G-d in purity.

Please join in and participate in the *Tashlich* service by meeting on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*, Tuesday, September 7 at 105th and Conser over Indian Creek at approximately 5:45 pm. *Tashlich* will conclude in time to return to the synagogue for the 6:30 pm *Mincha* and *Yom Tov Maariv*.


