From Your Rabbi...



I'm typing this installment, with the TV in the background, and watching an image of the first trucks rolling out to deliver the Pfizer vaccine, which was just approved by the FDA. I feel like we should declare this date as a new *yontif* national holiday! It seems that the end of this pandemic is finally in sight. I plan to get the vaccine as soon as it's generally available, and I'd encourage everyone who qualifies to do so as well, in consultation with your doctor of course.

The *Mishnah* teaches us that when someone is ill and thinks that they might need to eat on *Yom Kippur*, a doctor has to be consulted, in addition to a rabbi. If the doctor says that the patient needs to eat in order to sustain his life and health, then the patient is NOT ALLOWED to be 'pious' and choose not to eat; Jewish Law REQUIRES him to eat.

In Judaism we defer on scientific matters to the opinions of the scientific experts. In our country, if Dr. Fauci and the CDC and the FDA and all the major experts say that taking the vaccine is not only safe but essential in getting our normal way of life back and in saving many lives, then I believe that Jewish Law requires that we listen to those experts and act accordingly.

Many of us are now wondering: when will *shul* life return to normal? As Jews we tend to think on the timeline of holidays. As I look forward to the holidays of the spring, my gut tells me that by *Purim* we'll not yet be back to normal; by *Pesach* there's a good chance that we might, but it's sadly still doubtful; and by *Shavuot* I think there's a better than even chance that communities around the world will be able to stage their all night in person learning. That's my gut hunch prediction, based on no expertise, but I'm sticking with it!

Until then, let's all stay strong and resolute with the faith and the optimism that comes from knowing we can finally see that elusive "light at the end of the tunnel."

Wishing us all a good and safe winter.

From Your Vice-President...



I was introduced to Kehilath Israel on Meyer and Rockhill for the first time by a Catholic family who were members of the People to People organization whom I was staying with during my first Spring Break from KU. I had only been in the States for a couple of months at that time. When I entered Kehilath Israel, the beautiful sanctuary appeared more like a concert hall than the synagogues I was used to in Iran. In Iran we call synagogues *Kennesa*—it is probably the Judeo-Persian derivative of *Bet Kenneset*. The "*Kennisa*" that I grew up in of my hometown of Brojerd, in mountainous Western Iran, is probably about 200 years old. The main floor was designated for the men and women sat upstairs in the balcony.

My father, of blessed memory, had a business, in addition to being a volunteer *chazan* and *Bal Korah* (*Torah Reader*) for approximately 40 years in that synagogue.

So that was what I expected all synagogues to look like. Although Kehilath Israel did not look like that, I felt comfortable and accepted and welcomed by the "regulars" and joined them as a weekly attendee.

During the political upheaval in Iran, K.I.'s Mr. and Mrs. Club (a social club that existed at K.I. for many years) sponsored a discussion about the changes taking place in Iran and the effect on the Iranian Jewish Community. The panel included myself and other Persian students, moderated by Dr. Karla Klausner, a UMKC Professor of History with expertise in the Middle East. It was at this time that I met the lovely Kansas City native that eventually became my wife.

Since my wife's family were very active at another synagogue, we split our attendance between the two synagogues. But eventually my wife was convinced by the warmth and welcoming attitude of the K.I. spiritual family, as well as the melodious service, that we should become full members and shortly after that my in-laws followed us as full K.I. members. My father-in-law was only interested in the traditional service and felt at home, as the only difference was the lack of *mechitza*—everything else was the same as the Orthodox tradition.

Our son and daughter grew up in the synagogue, and, as regular *Shabbat* and holiday attendees, they felt like the regulars were a part of our family.

After many years of attending *Shabbat* and holiday services, as well as evening services, I was asked to become more active in the synagogue and became a board member and then an officer.

We are so fortunate to have a beautiful and Covid-safe sanctuary. And I am especially proud to be a part of Kehilath Israel Synagogue which plays such an important role in this community as a Traditional synagogue that follows the Orthodox tradition, with the exception of mixed seating. No other synagogue in our community fulfills this role. I certainly hope we will remain strong in our convictions.

GUARDIAN SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION AND APPLICATIONS

FIRST TIME CAMPERS INCENTIVE GRANTS – The Guardian Society provides “incentive grants” to children attending Jewish overnight camp for the first time on a first-come first-served basis. These grants will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, to children the first time they attend Jewish overnight camp for three weeks or longer and have not previously received a first-time camper grant. In order to qualify for the incentive grant, children must live in the Greater Kansas City area and attend an approved Jewish camp program.

Families who need assistance sending children to camp for fewer than three weeks are encouraged to apply for financial assistance from their congregations and from The Guardian Society.
