From Your Rabbi...



For this month's reflection, I present to you "A Tale of Three Countries." There are three countries for which I have loyalty and affection: the USA, Canada, and Israel. With regards to the US and Canada, I'm a dual citizen. For those who may not yet know my life story: I was born in Windsor, Ontario; moved to Philadelphia at age 3; moved to

Montreal at age 12; and then back to the USA after high school. So, I'm really half Canadian and half American. My connection to Israel stems, of course, from my Jewish identity and from the fact that my parents, my grandmother, my brother, and many cousins and aunts and uncles and friends all reside there.

With regards to the USA, I felt fear and disappointment this past week, as we witnessed an evil and deranged mob of domestic terrorists storm our Capitol building, causing mayhem, injury, and death. We all must *daven* for peace and calm to return to our country. With regards to Canada, I feel concern. Canada is currently under (yet another) full national lockdown to flatten the COVID curve. *Shuls* are generally only allowed to have around ten people per service, and I'm told that basically only those who have *yahrtzeits* or otherwise have to say *kaddish* are allowed to attend. An old friend of mine in Canada recently invited me to his son's *bar mitzvah* – on a weekday--on Zoom instead of in *shul* and on *Shabbat*, because even his immediate family, including grandparents and aunts and uncles, would constitute too many people to be able to have in person at *shul*.

And that brings us to Israel, the bright spot in this entire discussion. This month, I look upon Israel with great pride! Israel currently leads the world in per capita vaccination rate, and they're well on their way to becoming the first country to get the majority of its citizenry vaccinated. My parents, my grandmother, and my aunts and uncles there have already received their second shot. The Jewish State, the "Startup Nation," is now the "Vaccination Nation." They're putting us to shame!

It's hard to believe that *Purim* is fast approaching, at the end of February. *Purim* is a time of joy, but it also marks a somber anniversary this year, because *Purim* was the last holiday, last year, on which *shul* life at K.I. was "normal." We had a big feast in the social hall and a big public *Megillah* reading. That very *Shabbat*, all the *shuls* in town collectively decided to shut down. And so, it has apparently now been a full calendar year since this COVID plague has so disrupted our lives. I take solace in the thought that at least the citizens of the State of Israel might begin to emerge from the pandemic soon. My prayer is that we'll catch up and that we're not too far behind, and that before too long we can all celebrate our holidays again in the mode of Esther 8:16: "And for the Jews it was a time of light and joy, and gladness and honor." Amen

From Your Vice-President...



When Marty Gorin asked his administration to take turns introducing themselves in the *Focal Point*, I thought about how to best offer a snap shot of myself and my family in a manner that might allow our fellow members to better know us.

As a 2G, (2nd Generation) I represent many in the community who are the son or daughter of a Holocaust survivor. My father survived

Auschwitz along with other camps. He and his one brother were the only survivors of a large extended family from Rypin, Poland. My mother's family was expelled from Spain during the inquisition and ended up in Italy. Marlene's family is only a few generations beyond calling Ukraine and Russia home. In addition to our roots across Eastern Europe, we can also claim New York, New Jersey, Nebraska, and Texas as weigh stations on our way to landing at K.I. in Overland Park.

I remember the first time Rabbi Mandl observed that I am the product of a mixed marriage because of my Ashkenazi and Sephardic upbringing. (We ate well.) We are a blended family with diverse experiences, but we share so much more in common than we do differences.

In thinking about this, I realize that our family is a microcosm of the general K.I. family. In generations past, entire congregations would pick up from some *shtetel* in a very dark part of the world and follow their rabbi to the New World to begin again. Almost everyone in the *shul* had similar backgrounds and experiences. K.I. represents a newer and better version of our people. It is with awe that I mentally survey our congregational family. I am personally humbled by the combinations of paths and experiences that landed them here. I considered offering names and stories of K.I. members that have touched our lives, but the list would be too long.

With that in mind, I would like to offer a suggestion to our leadership. After the completion of the current cycle of officer bios penned themselves, we should add a new feature to the *Focal Point*. I would love to see us encourage a group of volunteers to interview fellow members and introduce us to the stories and experiences of the incredible group of people that we call Kehilath Israel. We are a vibrant and active community, and we have so much to learn about each other. We should move beyond Shabbat greetings and quick lunches following a *Kiddush* to build and strengthen our bonds. A great way to begin is to consider profiling the exciting families and individuals that have become members over the last year.

Please don't be concerned. I know how much we all look forward to Marty Gorin's column every month. I don't envision this feature as a replacement but as a supplement to what is already a very enjoyable publication.
