VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO MAKE PASSOVER MEAL DELIVERIES

Passover is not far away, and JFs and the Rabbinical Association of KC have teamed up for the annual food drive making sure those who are hungry will have all the makings to enjoy for a traditional seder.

Area congregations are collecting various Passover food items such as boxes of matzah ball soup mix, matzah baking mixes, matzah meal, potato starch. These items may also be dropped off during business hours in designated barrels in lobby of The J or JFS' Brookside location. Please donate items by March 31. You can also shop for these items through the JFS Pantry Wish List on Amazon (<https://amzn.to/3XH5v7Z>), your preferred online retailer or make a financial contribution to the pantry at jfskc.org/donate. This year, JFS will provide prepared Kosher-for-Passover meals to 240 client households (about 400 people) for the Festival of Freedom, which begins at sundown, Monday, April 22. Kosher Caterer Kim Matsil is preparing delicious, traditional meals that will include a main dish and dessert. In addition, each household will also receive fresh produce, matzah and matzah ball soup to celebrate the holiday. ISRAEL UPDATE - March 22, 2024

Iranian-Backed Houthi Terrorists Strike Israel with Cruise Missile

Israel confirmed on Tuesday evening that a "suspicious aerial target" that struck an open area near Eilat early Monday morning was a cruise missile. Yemen's Iranian-backed Houthi terrorists claimed responsibility for the missile, which crossed into Israeli airspace from the direction of the Red Sea. No damage or injuries were caused, but this incident marks the first time the Houthis have successfully hit Israeli territory. Meanwhile, the Houthis continue to launch attacks on international shipping off the coast of Yemen, targeting a Marshall Islands-flagged tanker vessel on March 15 and 17. The Houthi attacks have disrupted global shipping, forcing firms to reroute to longer and more expensive journeys around southern Africa. On Monday, the U.S. military struck Houthi targets in Yemen, destroying seven missiles and three drones that presented threats to merchant ships and U.S. Navy vessels; this is the latest in a series of U.S. and allied strikes on Houthi targets. Since October 7, Iran and its terrorist proxies have escalated attacks against Israel, America, and international commerce. The United States must increase the pressure on the Iranian regime by fully enforcing sanctions and taking military action when necessary to defend American interests.
