From Your Rabbi...



On Sunday afternoon, April 13th around 1:30, I received a text message from the police dispatcher requesting a chaplain to respond to shootings at the Jewish Community Campus and Village Shalom. I stared at the text for several minutes unable to comprehend what I was reading. It just didn't make sense to me that someone would target Jewish people and try to kill them. When I called

the dispatcher, I was told that there were three fatalities. This was beyond comprehension. I rushed over to the "J" and Village Shalom and saw the aftermath of the incidents, and was horrified. How can something like this happen in Overland Park, and if it can, are we Jews safe anywhere!

I am sure that there was a dark cloud over every *seder*, in every Jewish home in the world. With Frazier Cross's haunting words "Heil Hitler" echoing in our minds, reading Daniel Clevenger, mayor of Marionville, MO, affirming the same evil anti-Jewish propaganda of Nazi Germany, reciting the words of the *Haggadah*, "bichol dor v'dor omdim aleynu lichaloteynu" - in every generation they rise up against us to destroy us - there were many people at the *seder* this year who were not thinking of Egypt, who were not thinking of the Crusades, the Spanish Inquisition, the pogroms or the Holocaust, but were thinking of what happened right here in Overland Park.

This year at my *seder*, we discussed the paragraph recited when we open the door for Eliyahu that states, "Shfoch chamatcha al hagoyim"-Pour our your wrath against those who nations who do not know You and who have destroyed Jacob and his dwelling place. Until this past Sunday, I have always wondered why we recite these seemingly outdated words, especially in 21st century America, but now that the safety of our dwelling place has been breached, I understand how relevant they are. Our Sages were trying to convey to us that there will always be sick and vicious people who are obsessed with hatred of Jews, and some of these people are capable of striking out against us at any time. We need to be vigilant in recognizing who these people are and speak out against this vicious bigotry and hatred, whether aimed at us or any other people. Of course, the irony of this tragedy is that, although the Jewish community was the target, all three victims of this violence were Christians, and both institutions where the killings took place are open to and utilized by people of all religions.

However, something else took place in our community on Thursday morning, April 17th. Something uniquely beautiful that to my knowledge has never occurred in the vast history of our people, the coming together of people of all faiths within the entire Kansas City community, in a ceremony of unity and love and support of

I recently participated in a session for area synagogues about security led by Paul Goldenberg, National Director of Secure Community Network (SCN) and Chuck Clanahan, a Protective Security Advisor for the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS). Paul is also Vice-Chair of DHS's Faith Based Council. I am proud to say K.I. is on the forefront in security

and emergency planning. However, we can always do more, and we are looking at other initiatives. The challenge is to be warm and welcoming yet protect everyone. **THE** most important thing you as an individual can do is to be aware of your surroundings. If you see something that is suspicious or different, let our police officer, leadership, or staff know right away! I cannot stress this enough. We are in the process of communicating this message to vendors who work on our property as well. If they see something unusual, we want to know about it immediately.

Related to security, among other things, is usage of our building. If you want to use the building for any reason, you must obtain permission and schedule in advance with the office. This is for everyone's security, for insurance reasons, and to make sure there are no schedule conflicts. All plans must be approved through the office. Telling maintenance staff or clergy does not qualify as having plans approved. Also, do not take items from the building even if you plan to return them. Please email or call me in advance if this is necessary.

On a happier note, I am excited about some upcoming programming. First, this summer we are going to have three *Shabbat Alfresco* events on June 27, July 25, and August 22. On these fourth Fridays of the month, we will have a creative Friday night service outside followed by a catered picnic meal. These are to be family-oriented services led by Rabbi Shron. We have invited Temple Israel to join us for the service, and feel free to invite your friends and family. Come join us on June 27th in the outdoor sanctuary behind the synagogue for a relaxed, fun, family-oriented Friday night service and picnic. We'll have activities for the children after they eat as well.

The other upcoming programming I wanted to share is the creation of a young professionals' group. If you have family and friends between the ages of 22 and 39 who are not members, or grew up at K.I. but have not joined a synagogue, please call the office with their names and contact information. We want to invite them to participate and enjoy the camaraderie of social events as well as *mitzvot*.

WHY IS IT CUSTOMARY TO EAT DAIRY ON SHAVUOT?

It has become customary on Shavuot to eat at least one dairy meal during the holiday. Some see this as symbolizing "a land flowing with milk and honey." Others point out that the very same verses that speak of bringing "the choicest first fruits of the land unto the house of the Lord vour G-d" in celebration of Shavuot also stress that "You must not boil a kid in its mother's milk." (Ex. 23:19, 34:26.) On the basis of the latter part of these verses, the Oral Torah based its prohibition of eating meat and milk together. Hence, a separate dairy meal is deliberately eaten to emphasize the authenticity of the Oral *Torah*.

K.I. FRED DEVINKI EITZ CHAIM RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NEWS

We have had a fantastic spring holiday season at the K.I. Fred Devinki Eitz Chaim Religious School! For *Purim*, we made a wide range of crafts including masks and groggers, as well as child friendly "*Megillat* Esther." The Day of *Purim* was filled with *mitzvot*! We heard the *Megillah*, ate a "*seudah*," and made *hamantaschen* and chocolate chip cookies to put in our homemade "*mishloach manot* gifts." After dressing up in school, we continued the fun at the Atriums where we delivered our baskets with smiles and songs to the K.I. members there.

After *Purim* we quickly moved onto *Pesach*. Students also did a wide range of age appropriate activities from making *afikomen* bags and placemats, to the older children making their own fill in the blank "*Haggadot*." We spent several sessions helping each student memorize the *Passover* songs. A highlight of our *Passover* unit was the play that the oldest class put on for the entire school. The students worked hard, and it really paid off! We also enjoyed a lively model *seder* with a theme of "*Passover* in the Days of Old" where we reclined on the floor with pillows, wore "toga" style costumes, and enjoyed learning more about the *seder*, especially when the hail (marshmellows) came flying across the room.

My theme of this year's *Passover* education centered around each student continuing their link of the chain of Jewish tradition that started when we left Egypt. I elaborated on this point by including chains in the *Haggadot* and illustrated it by forming a circle of hands held. We observed how if one person broke the chain, then the message could not be passed on. It's important that each child see their vital role in a long and beautiful chain of Jewish people.

ANNUAL COMMUNITY-WIDE ALL NIGHT SHAVUOT PROGRAM - A KANSAS CITY TRADITION TO FEATURE KEYNOTE SPEAKER RABBI TOVIA SINGER

The Jewish community will join together for an evening of prayer, study and celebration at the annual all-night *Shavuot* program on Tuesday, June 3 at K.I. Synagogue. The evening begins at 8:15 p.m. with two *Mincha* services including a traditional and an egalitarian service. The celebration will include a catered dairy buffet dinner followed by a keynote featuring noted author, educator, popular radio talk show host and world renowned public speaker, **Rabbi Tovia Singer**. His topic: "The Battle of the Jewish Soul! Are the Missionaries Winning?"

Rabbi Singer is the Founder and Director of Outreach Judaism, an international organization dedicated to countering the efforts of fundamentalist Christian groups and cults who specifically target Jews for conversion. Through his stimulating and provocative appearances, Rabbi Singer has been an inspiration to thousands and addresses more than 100 audiences a year. Lecturing on college campuses and synagogues throughout the country has become an integral part of his work. He is the author of the book "Let's Get Biblical: Why Doesn't Judaism Accept the Christian Messiah?"

Rabbi Singer is a frequent guest on television and radio shows and is the host of one of Israel's most compelling radio talk shows. "The Tovia Singer Show" is a powerful and provocative voice of reason on Israel National Radio (Channel 7) in Israel. The live call-in program was driven by the compelling insights and dynamic style of its renowned host, Tovia Singer.

A rabbinic panel will respond to Rabbi Singer's keynote afterward and will include Rabbis Daniel Rockoff, David Glickman and Doug Alpert, moderated by Rabbi Mark Levin. Rabbi Singer will lead a study session at 1:30 a.m. and afterward, an informal study session will be led by Rabbis David Glickman, Rebecca Reice and Beryl Padorr. A sunrise traditional and an egalitarian service followed by breakfast will conclude this holiday celebration. Stay for a few hours or remain until dawn and engage in *ruach* and stimulating study opportunities throughout the night. Snacks and coffee will be served.

Shavuot comes fifty days after the first day of *Pesach*, after the counting of the Omer has been completed, and celebrates G-d's giving of the *Torah* to the Jewish people at Mt. Sinai. Learning is an integral part of Judaism and therefore, it is befitting for the community to come together at this time to study. *Shavuot* also celebrates the harvest season. It is a custom to read the Book of Ruth, the story of a woman who voluntarily converts to Judaism, as well as to stay up on the first night of *Shavuot* to study *Torah*, and then to say the morning prayers at sunrise. The Kansas City Jewish Community has celebrated this *Shavuot* tradition for over 30 years.

A catered dairy buffet dinner featuring a favorite selection of *Shavout* delicacies including blintzes and cheesecake will be served at 9:10 p.m. (See flyer for more information) There is no charge to the community to attend the study programs only, which begin at 10:15 p.m.

An all-night youth program planned by area youth and informal youth educators and directors will take place for rising 6^{th} - 8^{th} graders and 9^{th} - 12^{th} graders. More information will be available to youth soon or check kerabbis.org for details.






